

Protesters march for health care meeting with Blunt

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. A few hundred people hit the streets early Saturday in a protest to protect Obamacare.

The group marched outside the University Plaza Hotel and Convention Center trying to get U.S. Senator Roy Blunt to meet with them.

Missouri Medicaid Coalition members, including Empower Missouri, Jobs with Justice, Missouri Health Care for All, and Planned Parenthood of the St. Louis Region, called the gathering a street town hall, bringing their protest to Blunt, who was among Missouri Republicans gathered in Springfield for their annual Lincoln Days event.

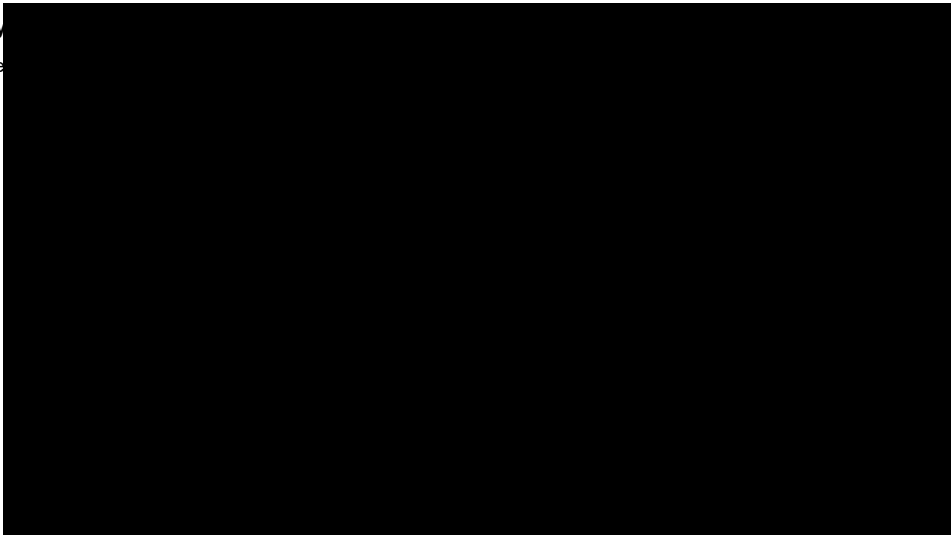
